Concert Dress

Unless otherwise specified, concert dress is as follows:

<u>Ladies</u>: Black skirt or black pants, white blouse, black shoes <u>Men</u>: Black pants, white dress shirt, black socks, black shoes

Please do not wear Blue Jeans, white sneakers or white socks!

Audiences perceive a well-dressed group as one that will sound good - before we even start playing.

Concert Attendance

Attendance for concerts is **mandatory**. For each concert you will receive either an A or F. As long as you show up for the concert, you get an A. Your concert attendance will be part of your grade in marking terms 2, 3 and 4. Concert dates are listed in the back of this handbook. If there is a conflict with a concert date, please let me know as far ahead as possible.

String Ensemble Rehearsals

As there are no small group lessons at the Middle School, rehearsals will involve several parts. Most of the time, we will be working as an ensemble rehearsing the music. Some of the rehearsals we will use for sectionals or small group work and some will be spent with some individual help. This is a team effort and all members must do their part.

For each rehearsal you will receive a grade for bringing your instrument and music and for your attitude/cooperation. You need a pencil so you can mark any changes in the music- **Please use only <u>pencil</u> to mark your music** (no pen, highlighter, crayon, magic marker or lipstick!)

** 6th Grade String students will need to purchase Essential Elements 2000-Book 2 as we will be using it to continue technique development. Be sure to get the book specific to your instrument!

Playing Tests

Playing tests will be given throughout the year. These tests will be on music and/or scales that we are working on in class. There is no such thing as a surprise playing test. You will always know at least two weeks ahead of time so you can be well prepared and I can answer any questions you may have. These tests can be in the form of large group, small group or individual assessment, either in person or recorded at home and emailed to me.

Home Practice

Home practice is to music as homework is to your academic subjects. It is an important time to review and sharpen skills taught in class. In order for the ensemble to sound it's best, each student must put their best playing to each rehearsal. As part of their quarterly grade, Grade 6 students will be asked to turn in their practice charts weekly for Mr. Schaefer to check.

Some practice tips:

- Studies have shown it is more beneficial to practice for a short amount of time, more often during the week than to practice less often for more time.
- One important item to have when you are practicing is a music stand. The wire ones are only about \$15-\$20. Your playing will not improve if you are trying to read your music when it is on the floor.
- Make sure you have good lighting. Bad lighting will strain your eyes and will cause you to get tired quicker.

- Try to be specific in your practicing. Concentrate on the parts that you have difficulty with. Don't just play the music that is easy and sounds good already. Also, you don't have to practice <u>all</u> the difficult material in one practice session.

If you put the time in you will feel good about your playing and improve the quality of the group at the same time.

Grading Criteria

Students will be graded each class on their effort, cooperation, and having their instrument and music.

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Each marking term students will start out with 100 points in the Materials and Effort/Cooperation categories. For each class that a student does not have materials or is uncooperative, they will lose 2 points in the respective category. Students should bring in a note from home if an instrument is broken and/or being repaired so no credit is lost.

Select Strings

Select Strings is open to students in grades 7 and 8 who are looking to play more challenging music, particularly those students who may be taking private lessons. Students must audition for this group. This group rehearses Wednesdays from 7:25 am–7:55 am and Period 8 one day out of the 6 day rotation. Extra rehearsals and performances will occur. Students will receive schedules on a regular basis to keep them informed of upcoming events.

Auditions for the 2019-2020 Select Strings ensemble will take place in May 2019. Auditions are open to 6th and 7th grade String students who participate and are in good standing in either the 6th Grade String Ensemble or 7/8 Grade String Ensemble. Students must be a member of the 7/8 Grade String Ensemble next school year if chosen for this group.

Junior Southeast

Junior Southeast District is open to students in grades 7-9. This festival is made up of students from all of Southeastern Massachusetts. Students must audition to be selected to participate.

The auditions are on December 8, 2018 and the Festival takes place March 8 and 9, 2019. Friday's rehearsal will require you to miss school for the day. There are 2 rehearsals and a concert on Saturday. There is an audition fee and if selected, a festival fee.
